

Dear Parent/Carer,

### RE: Update on the Closure of WMG Academy due to COVID-19

Further to our letters dated 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> March, we are writing with the latest update regarding the national closure of schools and the plans which are currently in place at WMG Academy.

We have already communicated directly with the parents of students who will be attending the Academy next week. The Government have given a clear directive that students should not attend the Academy, unless they are a vulnerable child or the child of a key worker. We are asking for your support to ensure this remains the case. If you have not received a letter confirming your child's attendance next week, please ensure that there is provision for them to work at home. Similarly, students will not be able to access the Academy's onsite ICT or Engineering facilities throughout the closure period.

#### **Free School Meals**

Students entitled to free school meals but who will not be attending the academy can collect a voucher to cover the cost of lunches for one week. The vouchers can be collected between 10am and 12pm on the Monday of every week of closure. The voucher will be valid at Gregg's and a value of £20 per student per week has been allocated.

# **Ongoing Communication**

We will continue to send parents daily updates until 27<sup>th</sup> March, and twice-weekly updates thereafter, along with relaying urgent messages as and when they are required. All letters sent to parents will also be added to our website at <a href="https://www.wmgacademy.org.uk">www.wmgacademy.org.uk</a>.

We understand that the uncertainty surrounding this unprecedented situation has a significant impact on our students, their families and their daily routines. As such, we will continue to offer pastoral support to our students remotely. Our priority is to keep our students and staff healthy, safe and supported.

## **Learning from Home**

Whilst your child is away from the Academy we will work hard to ensure they are well resourced to continue their learning and make progress within their subjects. Students will be set work for each subject on a regular basis via Google Classroom. Students should access this in exactly the same way that they do for homework. The work that has been set will direct students to a variety of tasks using on-line learning platforms such as Google Classroom, Seneca, Kahoot or MathsWatch.

Tasks set will be designed in a way that staff will still be able to monitor work and feedback to students via Google Classroom or Gmail. Feedback and dialogue between staff, students and parents is vital to ensure staff can monitor the workload, as well as physical and mental health of our students.

Senior staff with responsibility for the effectiveness of teaching and learning will be continually reviewing the on-line learning. The methods of learning outlined above may need to be amended if the period of school closure is extended or if significant numbers of staff and/or their families become affected by illness. The learning of Year 11 and Year 13 students should continue to ensure routine and consistency given the uncertainty around external examinations.

#### All students

- All students are able to login to their Google Drive, Gmail and Google Classroom from home by using the RM Unify login page. Visit <a href="www.rmunify.com">www.rmunify.com</a> and use the students' normal academy login details.
- By accessing their Google Drive, students will be able to continue with any coursework that is completed online e.g. Y10 and Y11 Engineering coursework units.
- By accessing Google Classroom, students will be able to access any specific subject tasks that are set by the teacher.

- Year 10 English Literature Please refer to Google Classroom, revision workbooks and exam materials are available.
- Year 11 English Language please refer to Google Classroom for past papers and revision resources.

- Other weekly resources
  - PSHE materials will be shared for Y10 on Google Classroom each Monday.
  - Weekly spelling practice will be shared on Wednesdays.
  - An article to practice literacy skills will be shared on Fridays.

#### Year 12 and 13

- Sixth Form students are encouraged to make direct contact via email with their subject teachers. This will be the best way to access guidance and subject materials.
- o Each student can still use Google Classroom to access relevant materials.
- Engineering students should continue to work on their assignments online, using the shared support materials.

#### **Inhalers**

We are aware that there is some concern about children having sufficient inhalers, so if we hold a spare inhaler at the Academy you may wish to come and collect this to have at home. Please ensure it is returned to us when the Academy reopens.
