SAFEGUARDING

We have recently been made aware by the Schools Policing Team of the dangers of certain apps that can be downloaded onto mobile phones. Some of these apps request young people to enter their personal information, including their home addresses, after which suspicious packages are sent to their address. The Police have informed schools that some of these packages may contain illegal or prohibited items and potentially dangerous, unregulated drugs, some of which can be used in vapes.

As a result, we request that parents are vigilant regarding any small packages being delivered in their child's name and if suspicious or concerned, seek advice, not to open them, retain them and inform the Police as soon as possible.

MEASLES (MMR) VACCINE REMINDER

Local cases of measles have been confirmed in Birmingham, Solihull, and Coventry.

Measles is highly infectious and can lead to complications, especially in vulnerable groups (infants, people with low immunity and pregnant people). While most people recover completely within a couple of weeks, measles can cause serious illness and in rare cases it can be fatal.

The best way to stay safe and protect yourselves as well as your families is to receive the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine. Vaccination with two doses of MMR is the best way to give people maximum protection and life-long immunity. To get vaccinated or check you or your child's vaccination status, please contact your GP. Pork-free vaccines are also available on request.

Please be aware of measles symptoms, including: a high temperature, rash, and a runny or blocked nose, sneezing, a cough, or red, sore, watery eyes.

If you think you or your child may have measles, contact your GP practice, or call 111.

Do not visit your GP practice or any healthcare setting, unless advised by a healthcare professional, because measles can spread easily to others.
