

How to succeed in English Language (GCSE) (written by a cool person)



So we're back at this again - issue 2 of the English Language advice article! If you weren't present for the first airing of this series, last issue we discussed the idea of developing points further with a technique involving asking oneself "why", an effective technique taught a fair few years ago to me by some teacher somewhere. Useful for language papers 1 and 2 alike, which is absolutely beneficial for all things marks-wise

To follow up this gratefully supplied revision material, I shall explain more techniques you can use to heighten your ability to effectively answer the variety of questions given across the AQA specification papers.

Right, this time let's take a gander at structure - we'll jump between structure and methods between every issue, to give us a variance in given information, and to help this feel less stale.

With every structure technique you will use, you will respectively need to identify it in one of the extracts given with your paper. But, an important thing to consider is that almost anything can be considered a structural technique. Of course there are the louder ones, such as alliteration, shifts in tone, and repetition. These are decently well known (tonal shift is a tad harder to pick up on however) so are typically mentioned more in papers. They are also some of the go-to devices in question 5, meaning you will need to use them effectively to gain an edge over others in terms of your marks.

I'll briefly mention the rest of PAFOREST as well, given that I mentioned alliteration. Only use it for question 5 on paper 2. They are structural devices that enhance the rhetorical (speech) ability of the text, whereas paper 1 is looking for something descriptive or explanatory. They can still be useful on their own, and are decently easy to integrate, but they should not be a significant focus of paper 1.

Going back to the first point; almost anything can be considered structure. Obviously not language techniques such as adjectives and (mostly) metaphors, and plain old words aren't either. However, if you have two words, that could be an example of structure. Sentence length is an easy one to miss out on, but sentence length variation lets you link to ideas of:

Tension and/or fear

Commitment/confidence

Deep understanding and acknowledgement

Chaos and disorganisation

Depending on the combinations of short and long sentences and how often they're used. Shorter sentences emphasise tension, whereas long ones emphasise confidence.

What about paragraphs? They're like sentences but longer! And guess what, the same applies - Long, in-depth paragraphs emphasise clearance, clarity, and confidence (look at that cheeky little triplet I put in there). Shorter paragraphs often suggest a shift in tone, and a significant build in tension. The single sentence paragraphs reiterate this, and often imply something notable and harrowing has occurred.

Even clauses; you can do it with them too. As well as sentence length, sentence composition matters too. More main clauses, again, like short sentences suggest something tense, unclear and chaotic. Subordinate clauses, like long sentences, imply something is more clear or understandable. The amount of them matter too - more clause combinations in one sentence, if written as such, can add upon to this idea.

In summary, structure is very useful to know how to recognise, and keep an eye out for any in the extract for your benefit in lang 1 question 3, and the whole of paper 2. While there are notable techniques you should always use when possible, remember that every sentence can have a form of structure you can write about, and how it links to the bigger picture - I haven't even begun to talk about tone, perspective, and time shifts in text.

Regardless, stay in tune for the next issue of this paper, and also remember there are dictionaries and thesauruses in S04 :D

Arthur Christmas


Score: 4 / 5

Home Alone



Score: 4.5/ 5

If you are an individual who has started a savings account in which a portion of your working wage goes into in order to save up for your own abode (which should really be none of you but let me get there), then you'll have noticed an interesting trend in prices of said abodes have increased just a *little* bit in proportion to the adjusted increase in wages.

In 2005, the average price of a house was somewhere in the £150,000 ballpark. A good chunk of money still, but nothing compared to the range of £300,000 to £500,000 that seems to be occurring now. 
